# Corporate Gift-Matching Multiplies Donation

Versailles native Alex Cordonnier received a scholarship from the Darke County Foundation in 2013 and earned a degree in computer science from the University of Illinois in 2017. Armed with talent and motivation, the young professional moved to California to start a job in software engineering, launching a promising career with west-coast style.

Not one to forsake his roots, Alex expressed his allegiance to his home community by making a generous donation to the Darke County Foundation.

"I'm glad to be able to give back not only to my hometown but to all of Darke County," said Alex. "The community is incredibly

supportive, engaged, and passionate about helping people excel. There's no place quite like it."

Upon graduating from Versailles High School in 2013, Alex received a scholarship from the Darke County Engineering and Science Fund of the Darke County Foundation, established by Greenville residents Dennis and Shirla Neff. His gratitude in receiving the award prompted Alex to make a donation

to the same fund, a gesture the Neffs hoped would happen when they set up the scholarship in 2007. The Neffs wanted other donors to follow their lead and add to the fund that encourages Darke County students to pursue careers in engineering and science.

Another factor in Alex's decision was the gift-matching program his employer offered. The company contributed *two times* the amount its employee donated, effectively tripling the gift amount.

"When I found out about my company's charitable giving program, my first thought was the Darke County Foundation," said Alex. "I wanted to pay forward the scholarship that helped me to pursue my dream in order to give future students the opportunity to pursue theirs."

### Former Franklin-Monroe Teacher Donates \$1 Million

Alice McKibben Frantom graduated from Ansonia High School in 1949 and Miami University in 1953. Alice taught at Franklin-Monroe schools for 25 years, where her husband, Wilbur (Bud) Frantom, also taught agriculture and served as principal. Alice and Bud earned a modest living and were careful stewards of their finances.


Having no children of their own, the couple dedicated themselves to helping others in the community. They provided generous financial assistance to college students in need and to families with large medical expenses. After retiring, the couple moved to Florida, where Bud died unexpectedly in 1996. Alice went on to volunteer for 25 years at Cape Coral Hospital in Florida, accumulating 10,000 hours of service. When Alice died in 2018, she left over \$1 million to the Darke County Foundation for scholarships to Darke County students.

The Frantoms' humble lifestyle, wise money management, and overflowing hearts are an inspiration to others wishing to enrich the Darke County community after they are gone.



### Mike Thieme Leaves Generous Bequest

Long known in Darke County as a successful businessman and generous community leader, Walter (Mike) Thieme bequeathed over \$800,000 to the Darke County Foundation upon his death in September 2018. The fund, named after Mike and his wife, Jean Louise, who died in 2009, will provide community grants to local non-profit organizations. This is the second fund the Thiemes established at the Founda-

tion; the first was the Jean Louise Thieme Children's Theatre Fund set up in 1987.

An Army officer, engineer and test pilot, Mike earned degrees from Montana State and Harvard University. He spent 40 years with Greenville-based American Aggregates and served on the boards of Wayne Hospital and Dayton Children's Hospital. Mike and Jean Louise contributed to many community improvement projects and were active at St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Greenville.

After retiring, Mike and Jean Louise lived

part-time in Jackson Hole, Wyoming, and were major supporters of Jackson Hole Center for the Arts. Among his many hobbies, Mike climbed Mount Kilimanjaro, the highest mountain in Africa, four times between the ages of 71 and 80. He went around the rim to the highest point (19,341 feet) at age 74, making the Guinness Book of Records as the oldest climber to achieve the feat at that time.

Throughout his life, Mike reached great heights, but it is his generosity to his community that will be remembered through this community fund at the Darke County Foundation.

# Rodney Oda Provides Long-Term Support for St. Mary's Catholic School

St. Mary's Catholic School in Greenville has always held a special place in the heart of Greenville resident Rodney Oda. He attended the school in the 1960s and currently serves as chairman of the school's finance and operations committee. Oda says the school offers a strong academic and spiritual environment, and has a genuine commitment to the overall development of each student.

Because of his allegiance to the school, Oda established the Principal's Fund for St. Mary's School at the Darke County Foundation. Each year, investment income from the fund will provide a distribution to St. Mary's School for student tuition assistance or school needs. Oda's original gift amount is intended to remain intact.

St. Mary's School is one of over 500 non-profit organizations in Darke County. Most of these groups are eligible to receive grants from funds that donors set up at the Darke County Foundation. The fund can provide annual distributions to the organization, preserving the original gift amount, or it can distribute the entire gift amount over a shorter period. Either way, the donor receives a tax benefit for the charitable contribution to the Foundation.

## **Pohl Transportation** Starts Scholarship Fund

With an abundance of job opportunities in the transportation industry, Pohl Transportation in Versailles established a fund at the Darke County Foundation to encourage students to pursue transportation-related careers. The company hopes the scholarship will motivate graduates to bring their talent back home and work for local transportation businesses.


Brian Pohl, President of Pohl Transportation, said about the supply chain industry, "Transportation and logistics have become very technical, data-driven fields, and the 18-wheeled

trucks one sees going down the road are computers with wheels. We need young people who enjoy studying logistics, computer science, and diesel mechanics to join the growing supply chain industry."

The 2018 scholarship recipients were Ryan Bruening, St. Henry, and Colleen Jutte, Minster, both studying supply chain management.

The Pohl Transportation Scholarship Fund was set up as an endowment, which means the gift amount is invested long-term, with annual scholarship payments coming

scholarships every year in perpetuity.



The annual scholarship is open to high school seniors or post-high school students studying logistics, supply chain management or diesel technology. Applicants may attend 4-year colleges, 2-year technical schools, or shorter certificate programs. Eligible counties include Darke, Mercer, Shelby, Miami and Auglaize.

## Foundation Awards over \$400,000 in Scholarships and Grants


